## The Spring Term

Welcome back and a Happy New Year! We look forward to hearing about the children's Christmas holidays as they settle back into the Spring Term and warmly welcome the children joining us this term.

Looking at the term ahead, our topic is based around animals and is titled "Wild about Animals". You can find an outline plan of our term's activities on the curriculum boards in the cloakroom. All other activities are planned according to the children's developing interests and taken from observations the staff make.

If there are any changes to your child's PE, Music or Forest School groupings we will let you know but if you are unsure please check the cloakroom board. Forest School sessions will start week commencing Monday 13 January. Please ensure the children are dressed appropriately for the weather and have a spare change of clothes in school.

This term we would like you to think about a Nursery Rhyme for your child to learn. This is in response to our upcoming Nursery Rhyme Festival. We will practise reciting your chosen Nursery Rhyme very informally in class and then gather for a special Early Years assembly where the children will have a chance to recite it to a larger audience. We ask that you send in a copy of your chosen piece for us to keep in our classrooms.

We would really appreciate it if cuddlies and toys from home could stay at home to avoid distress at the end of the day when they cannot be found. If your child still needs the reassurance of a comforter or stays all day and needs a cuddly for quiet time, then please encourage your child to leave it in their bag or in the cuddly basket in the cloakroom.

For the safety of the children please could we ask you to ensure that the Nursery door is closed securely behind you, and you do not let any child out that isn't holding onto their parent's or carer's hand. Please also remember it is an EYFS requirement that mobile phones may not be used within the EYFS buildings; we appreciate your support with this.

Water is always available, and the children are given a choice of milk or water at snack times. Your child is welcome to bring in their own named water bottle but we

ask you to take it home at the end of the session and bring it back refreshed the next time they are in school.

Please inform the school office if you change your email address. Please also check "Manor Messages" on the website in case there are reminders for the week ahead.
