Dear Parents

River Pang Visit

On **Friday 2 October**, as part of this term's Geography theme of Rivers, Year 5 will be performing fieldwork at the River Pang in Berkshire. The centre is based at Rushall Farm, near Bradfield, Berkshire. We will be leaving school at 9:00am and returning in time for the end of the school day.

As we will be outdoors all day, the children will need to wear comfortable clothing and will need to bring a waterproof jacket with a hood. Trousers will be more suitable than shorts as there are nettles and brambles along the paths. The children should wear trainers or walking boots and bring a pair of Wellington boots, in a plastic bag, to change into on arrival. We would like them to bring along a change of clothing, especially socks, which they can leave in a safe place during the visit.

We will be pond dipping during the day and whilst the chances of infection are low, we would ask that any cuts and scratches are covered with waterproof plasters.

The school will provide a mid-morning snack and a packed lunch.

In light of the government guidelines, which have been given to schools with regards to COVID-19, we have taken a number of measures in order to minimise the risk to both pupils and staff. These measures include:

- using 2 coaches to allow for social distancing
- ensuring the coaches arrive straight from the depot, have been thoroughly cleaned and have not been used by any other schools prior to our use that day
- ensuring pupils sanitise their hands regularly throughout the day
- keeping pupils within the Year 5 'bubble'; we have ensured there will be no other schools working on the site of Rushall Farm during our visit

In addition to this, we shall also be taking the temperature of all Year 5 pupils as they enter the school gate on Friday morning. Should they be found to have a temperature of 38 degrees or above, they will unfortunately be unable to join us on the trip and you will be asked to take your child home. Children travelling to school by bus will have their temperature checked upon arrival at school.

All children will be required to wear a face mask on the coach to and from Rushall Farm. The school will provide your child with a disposable mask, however if your child would prefer to bring their own, please ensure it is packed in their bag. If there is a medical reason why your child is not able to wear a face mask, you will need to show us an exemption card prior to the trip.

Please also find attached below the risk assessment from Rushall Farm, which will give you further information about the measures that have been put in place to keep everyone safe.

Please note that if you have declared your child to have asthma/an allergy requiring an adrenaline auto-injector (AAI) on their school medical form and they have been prescribed an inhaler/AAI, your child will not be allowed to leave the school site without their device.

Please also be aware that the bus company will insist that the children wear the safety restraints provided, which could either be seat belts or lap belts depending on the individual coach used.
